Course at a Glance

Ward 34 is a one-day comprehensive clinical skills and simulation program designed by Monash Simulation in collaboration with Ward 34 at Monash Medical Centre, Clayton. The course aims to equip participants with a structured approach to the assessment and management of deteriorating patients, specifically focusing on the medical and nursing care of acutely unwell gastroenterology and renal patients on the ward.

Course Topics

- Utilising a structured A – E approach for the assessment and management of deteriorating patients on the ward
- Identifying ways to stabilise a patient considering the nuances of both gastroenterology and renal specialties
- Exploring ways to effectively work as a team when caring for acutely unwell patients

The course uses a blended educational approach, including and facilitated discussions, interactive workshops and immersive simulation scenarios.

The course is aimed at medical and nursing staff working on the acute gastroenterology and renal ward at Monash Medical Centre, Clayton.
