Take home messages about transfusion from Tass:

- Not everyone with anaemia needs a blood transfusion 
- If fibrinogen is low it needs an explanation 
- Plan ahead for patients who may need a procedure 
- Anticoagulation should be reversed with major bleeding, even if the target is 'in range'

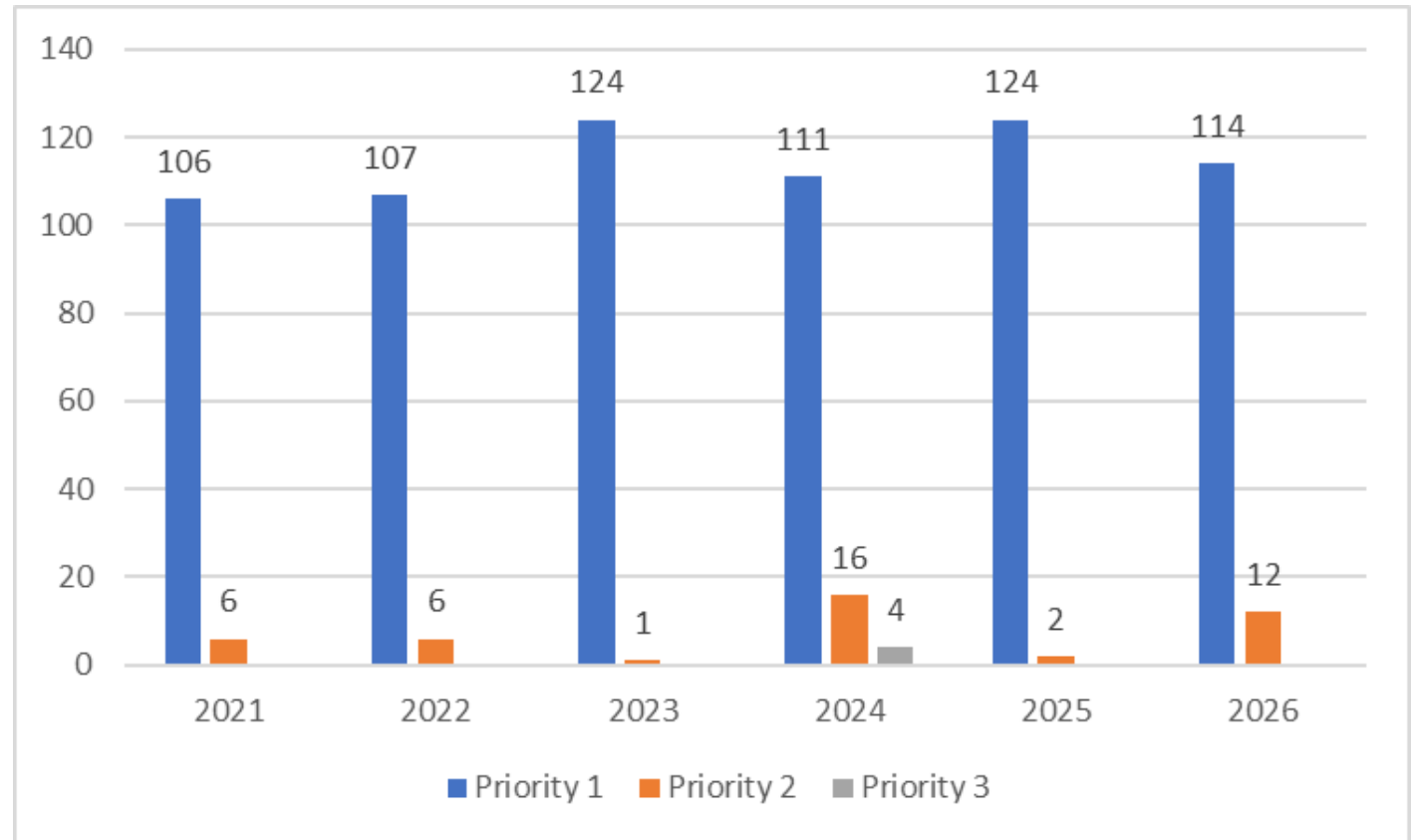

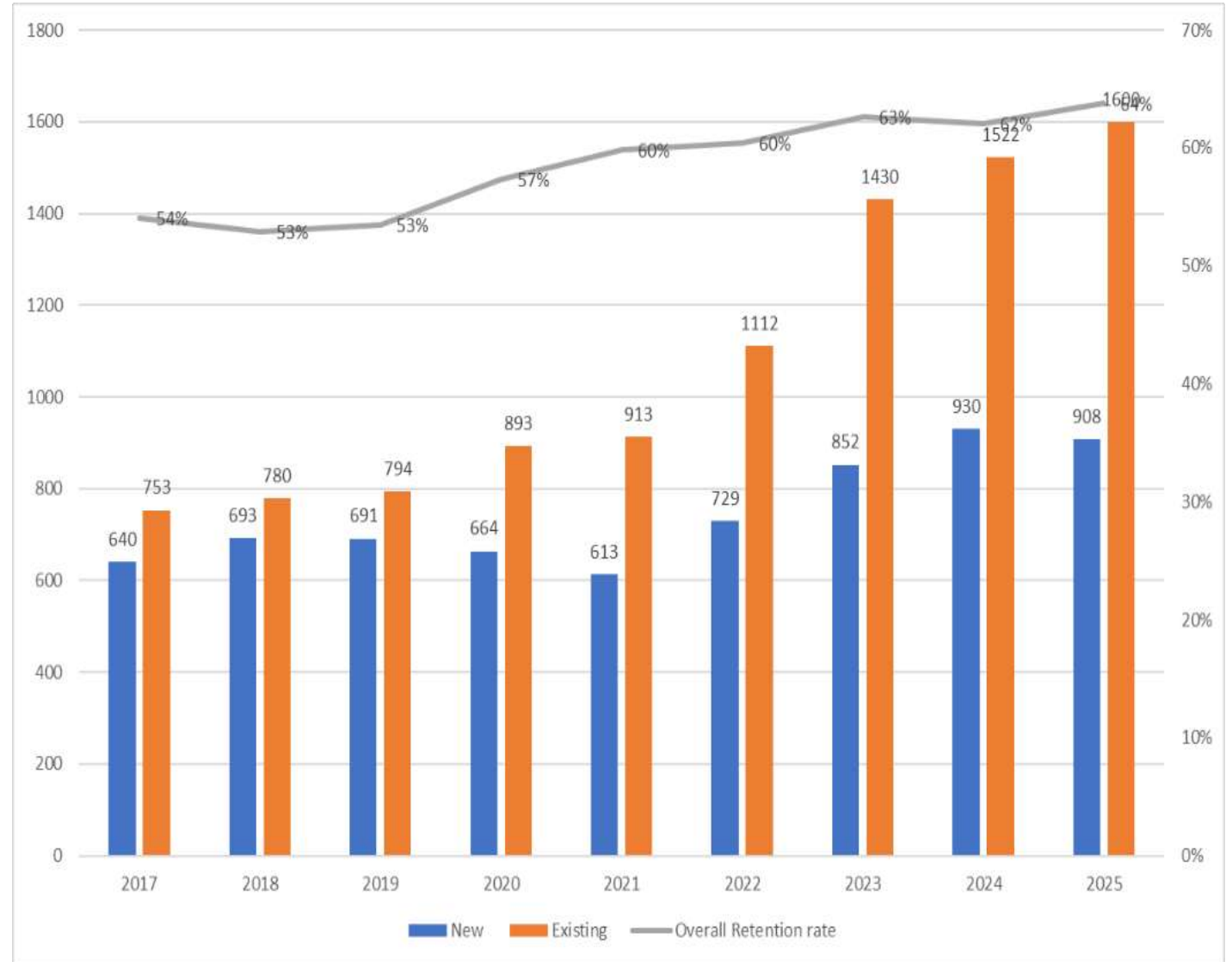

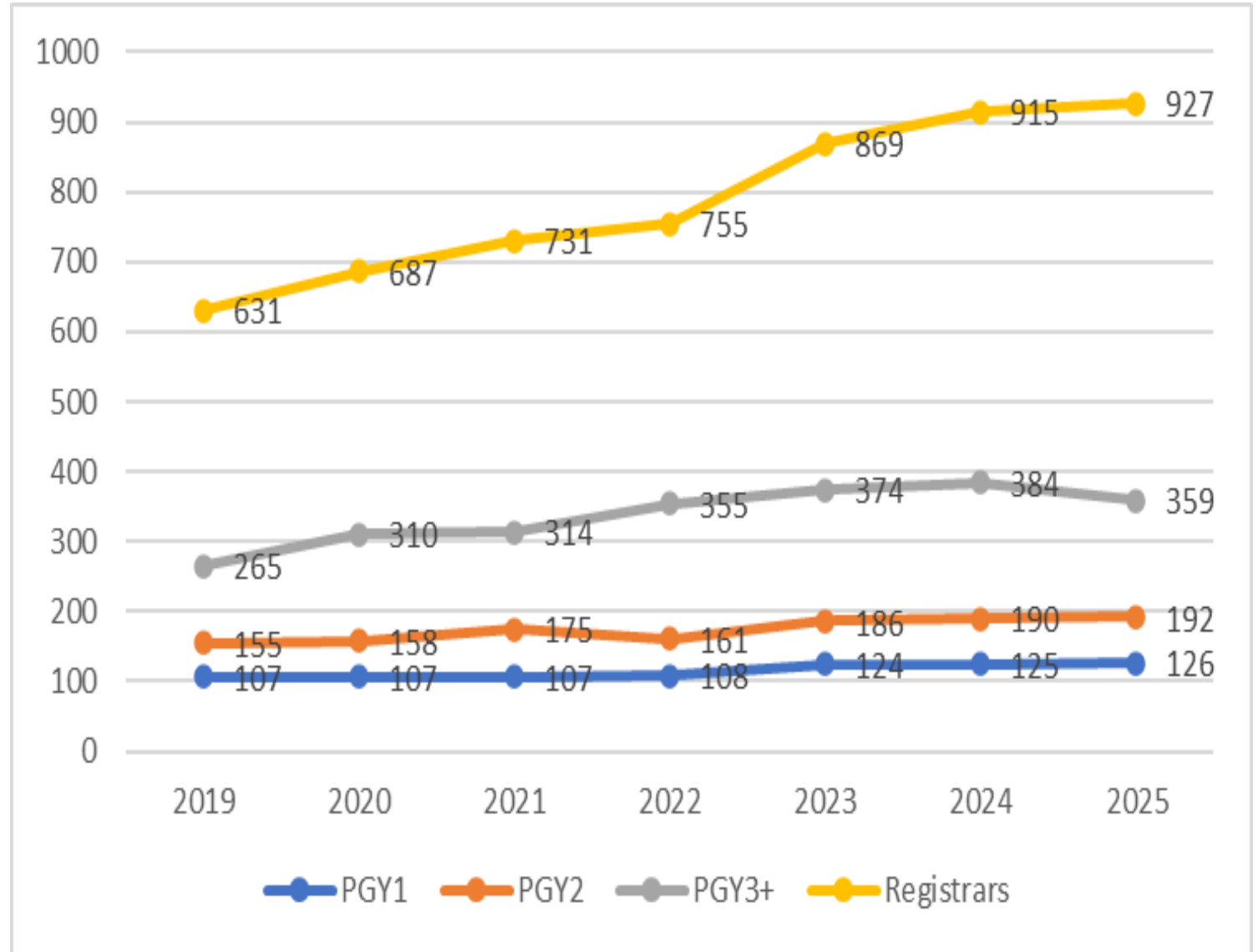

National Framework for PGY1's

- Complete a minimum 47 weeks.
- Gain exposure to all four clinical experiences.
- Complete PGY1 within 3 years.
- Meet all the prevocational outcome statements by the end of the prevocational year.
- Supplementary evidence will need to be provided if an outcome statement was unable to be achieved during the year (e.g., course attendance).
- Undergo a mid-term and end-of-term assessment each term.



What are the Clinical Experiences?

Clinical Experience A: Undifferentiated Illness Patient Care

The prevocational doctor must be actively involved in the assessment and initial management of the patients during the rotation.

Clinical Experience B: Chronic Illness Patient Care

The prevocational doctor must be actively involved in the chronic care management of the patients during the rotation.

Clinical Experience C: Acute and Critical Illness Patient Care

The prevocational doctor must be involved in the acute care management of patients.

Clinical Experience D: Peri-operative/procedural patient care

The prevocational doctor must have experience in caring for patients undergoing procedures, including pre, peri and post-operative phases of care.



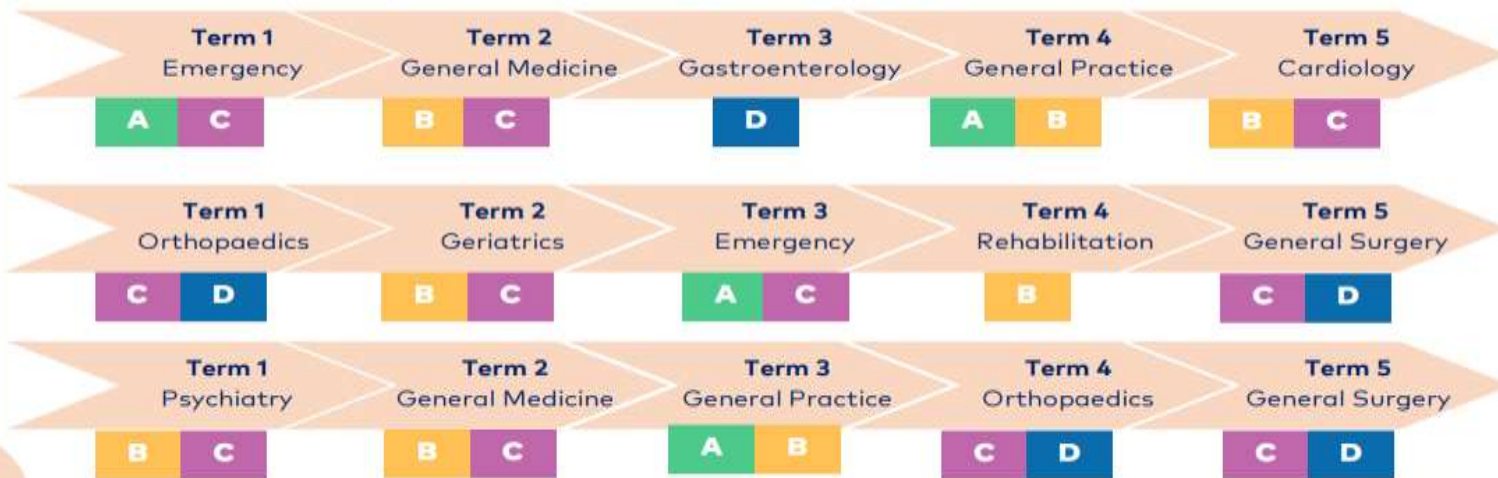
What does a PGY1 year look like?

Clinical Experiences mapped to Terms - what could a PGY1 year look like?

The Clinical Experience classification of a term is determined by the model of care of each unit and may vary between each health service.



Below are some examples of how a PGY1 year might progress:



Rotation Allocation Process

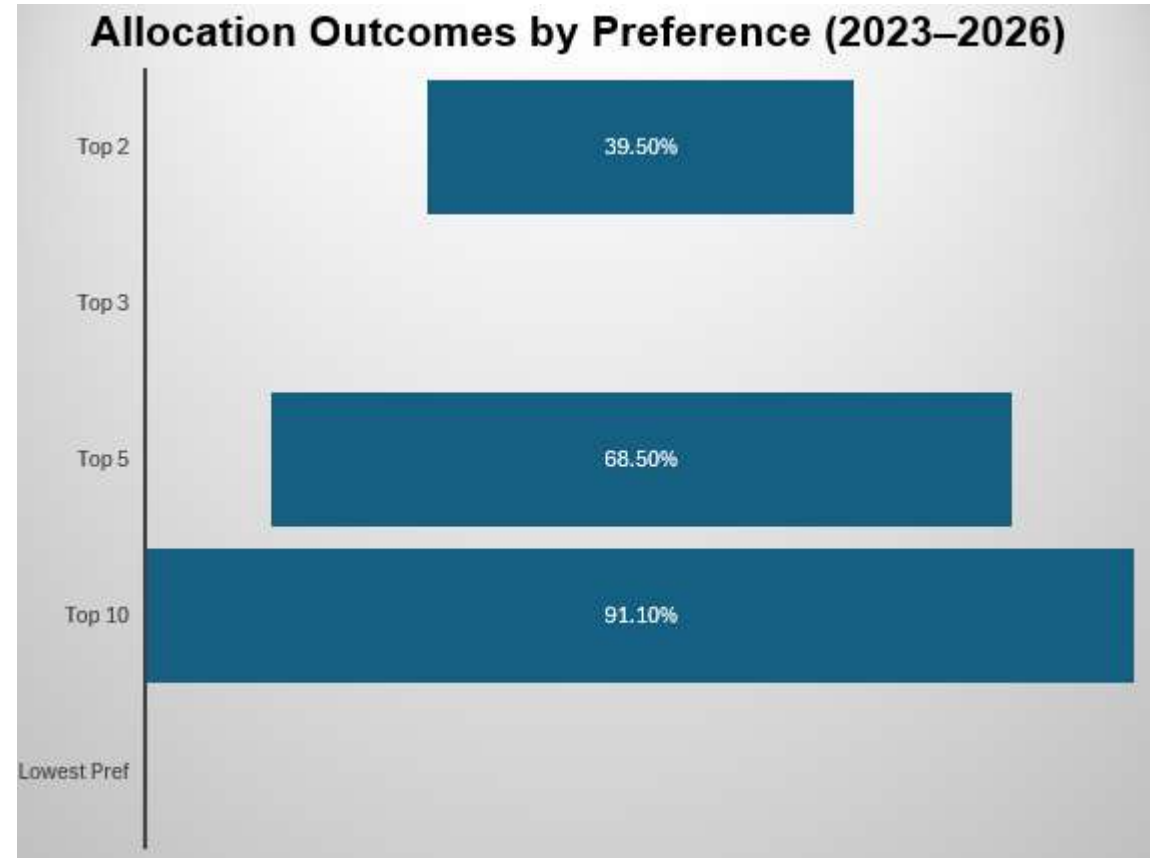
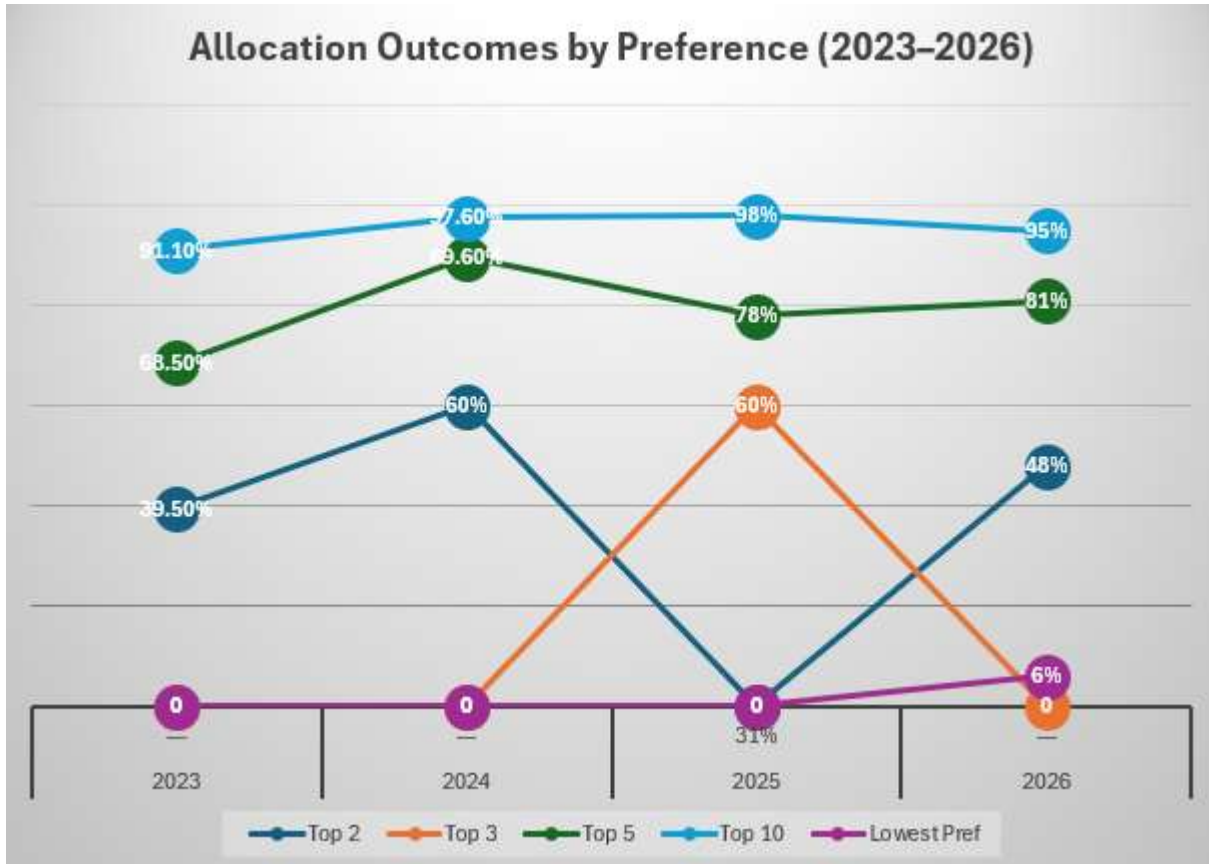
- Rotations are allocated based on 119 lines with 5 term rotations in each line.
- Interns' preference job lines.
- Interns rank each line from 1-60 with - 1 being most preferred allocation line.
- Rotations are allocated via an algorithm, taking into consideration:
 - Job line preferences
 - Career pathways
- Rotation swap requests are considered provided that PMCV requirements are met.
